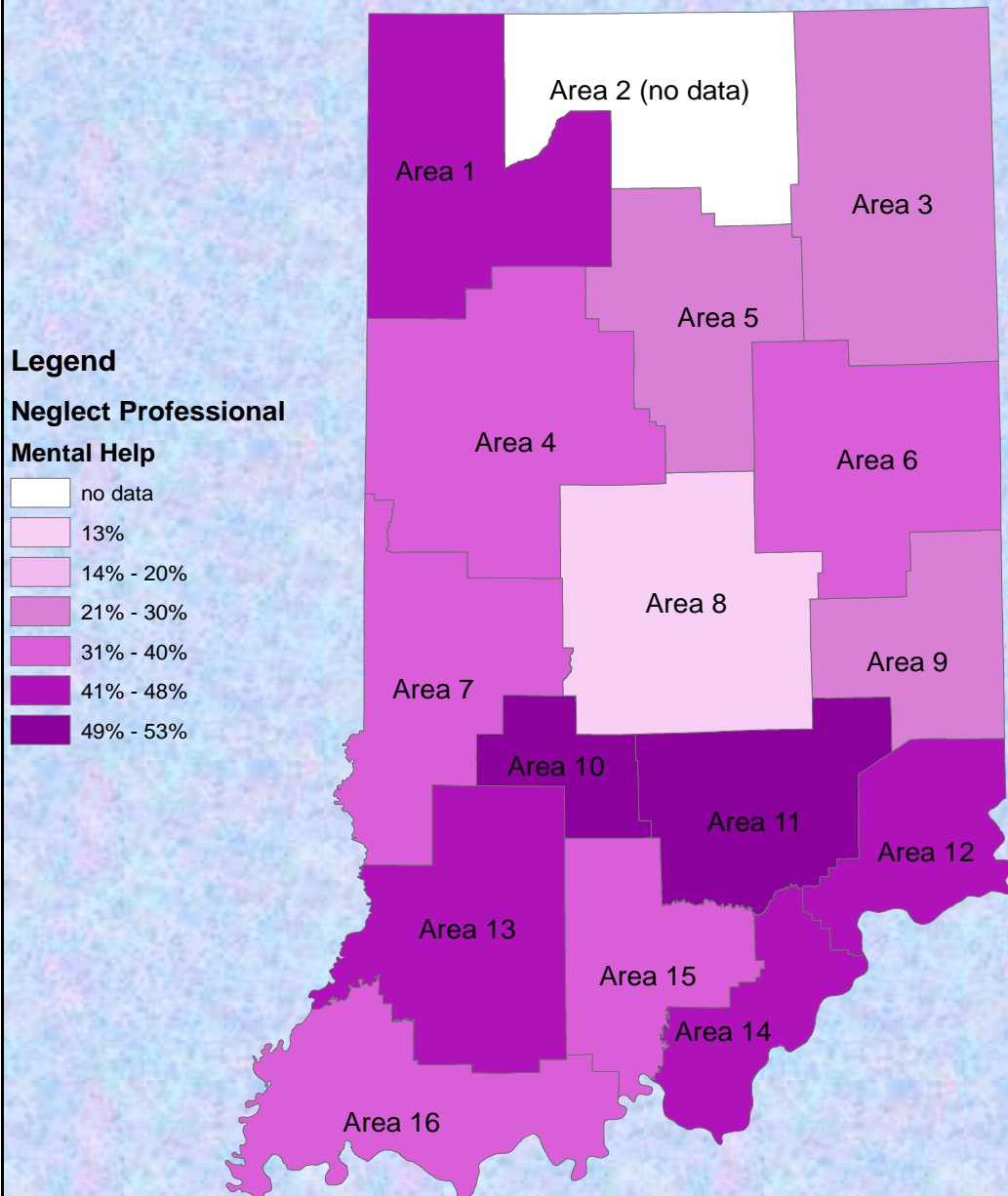


Percentage of Seniors Ages 60+ in each Area Agency Region who Thought They Needed Professional Help for Anxiety or Depression who Did not Seek Help



*Data on the proportion of seniors who have sought professional help or not sought professional help is based on a sub-sample of those seniors who reported that they thought they needed professional help for depression or anxiety within the past year. The data provided in this chart are drawn from the *AdvantAge Initiative 2008 Community Survey of Adults Aged 60 and Older*, conducted in 15 service areas and 5 supplemental areas in the state of Indiana - a stratified random digit dial (RDD) telephone survey of a representative sample of 4,969 non-institutional adults aged 60 and older, with sample sizes ranging from 300 to 303 for each Area Agency Region. Area 2 results are not reflected on the chart (including the counties of Elkhart, Kosciusko, LaPorte, Marshall and St. Joseph).
